The square-shaped plain red Tsuba has a small cylindrical hole and some Sekikin.

Decorations, a splendid Nanako-ji pattern along the edge, and elaborately inlaid with coloured patterns of gold, silver, copper, and Shakudō

It depicts the five main grains of Japan: rice, barley, beans, wheat, beans, and millet (Awa and Kibi). Tsuba is suitable for a Wakizashi.

The mainline of the 後藤家族 Gotō family has existed for many years of seventeen generations. Gotō Den 後藤伝 Main- i.e. Shirōbei-Line 四郎兵衛 Kyōto later Edo period.

This Tsuba is made by Gotō Mitsuyoshi 後藤光美 15th gen. 1788-1843. Another name of the 15th Gotō. generation is Shinjō 真乗 He is a son of Keijō 京城 also known as Gennojō 源之丞 and Kameichi 亀市.
